Basic Facts: Intensive Seminar Series on Interdisciplinarity in Translation & Interpreting (T&I) -- Cognition, Communication, & Language, a multi-institutional initiative by 4 universities (Shanghai International Studies University, China; University of Geneva, Switzerland; University of Fribourg, Switzerland; Johannes Gutenberg Universität Mainz, Germany), 1 language service provider (Dokumentation ohne Grenzen GmbH, Germany), and 1 international organization (United Nations Office at Geneva), is a flagship event of the Interdisciplinary Research Center, Graduate Institute of Translation and Interpretation, Shanghai International Studies University, who hosts and coordinates the lectures and activities. We are grateful to Swissnex China for their constant support.

The course focuses on interdisciplinarity in and around T&I, in particular, the cognitive approach to interdisciplinary studies and the impacts of artificial intelligence, technology and data on T&I, as they are playing an increasing role in academia, industry and society.



**Participants:** Up to 50 individuals; a) MA and PhD students; b) T&I trainers at postgraduate level or its equivalent and other academics; who are involved in research in translation and interpreting studies or in other doctoral fields where translation, interpreting or intercultural communication is a focus of interest; c) language professionals who either aspire to update their knowledge and skills to re-orientate themselves and acquire new competences.

#### **Course Modules:**

The workshop offers a 7-day course. For the first 6 days, participants will be involved in a series of lectures, presentation and critical discussion of different methodological, epistemological and ontological approaches in 6 topics, focusing in particular on helping them improve their research and professional skills. Participants shall be awarded a completion certificate after passing the exams taken place on the last day of the course.
